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SUMMARIES OF BILLS FILED

Public Bills

HOUSE BILLS

H 1125. [TEEN DATING VIOLENCE PREVENTION ACT.](#) Filed 5/24/12. *TO PROVIDE FOR THE EDUCATION OF NORTH CAROLINA HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ABOUT TEEN DATING VIOLENCE AND ABUSE.*

Enacts new GS 115C-407.25 to require each local board of education, by January 1, 2013, to adopt and implement a dating violence and abuse policy, which must meet specified requirements. Also adds the requirement to GS 115C-81 (Basic Education Program) to add teen dating violence and abuse to the health education program. Applies beginning in the 2012-13 school year.

H 1126. [REPEAL INCREASE IN INSTRUCTIONAL DAYS.](#) Filed 5/24/12. *TO REPEAL THE LAW INCREASING THE NUMBER OF INSTRUCTIONAL DAYS IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.*

Amends GS 115C-84.2 to provide that a school calendar includes, among other requirements, a minimum of 180 days (was, 185 days) and 1,000 hours (was, 1,025 hours) of instruction. Adds a requirement that the

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calendar include five teacher workdays, as scheduled by the local board of education. Makes conforming changes. Effective July 1, 2012, and applies beginning in the 2012-13 school year.

H 1127. GASTON COMM. COLL. MULTICAMPUS FUNDING. Filed 5/24/12. *TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE GASTON COLLEGE EAST CAMPUS MULTICAMPUS SITE.*

Requires the State Board of Community Colleges to approve the Gaston College Kimbrell Campus multicampus site. Requires that \$487,436 of the funds appropriated to the Community Colleges System Office for the North Carolina Center for Applied Textile Technology for 2012-13 be used to operate the Kimbrell Campus. Effective July 1, 2012.

H 1128. OPPORTUNITY ADVANCEMENT ZONES. Filed 5/24/12. *TO PROVIDE TIER ONE TREATMENT FOR OPPORTUNITY ADVANCEMENT ZONES.*

Enacts new GS 143B-437.014 to define an *opportunity advancement zone* as an area (1) that contains one or more contiguous census tracts, block groups, or both and (2) where each tract or block group meets one of the specified household income and unemployment rate measures. Sets a limit of 5% of the total area of the county on the portion of a county included in one or more opportunity advancement zones. Directs the Department of Commerce to annually publish a list of all opportunity advancement zones. Enacts new subsection (k) to GS 143B-437.08 to designate an opportunity advancement zone in a development tier one county as development tier one. Designates a zone located in a county without development tier one designation as the next lower development tier. Amends several provisions in Article 3J (tax credits for growing businesses) of GS Chapter 105 to add opportunity advancement zones, and treats the zones as development tier one areas. Effective for tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2013.

H 1129. REMOVE RESTRICTION/FIREFIGHTER DISABILITY (=S 869). Filed 5/24/12. *TO REMOVE THE REQUIREMENT THAT FIREFIGHTERS AND RESCUE SQUAD WORKERS HAVE ONE YEAR OF CREDITABLE SERVICE IN ORDER TO QUALIFY FOR DISABILITY RETIREMENT BENEFITS UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR INJURIES INCURRED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.*

Identical to S 869, filed 5/22/12.

H 1130. NON-GENERAL FUND NAT'L GUARD IMPROVEMENTS. Filed 5/24/12. *AUTHORIZE THE CONSTRUCTION, WITHOUT APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE GENERAL FUND, OF CERTAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS OF THE NORTH CAROLINA NATIONAL GUARD.*

As the title indicates. Authorizes \$600,000 in available federal receipts to fund specified capital improvement projects of the National Guard. Additionally authorizes the NC National Guard to use up to \$20,000 of federal receipts to expand its motor pool at Fort Bragg. Appropriates these funds for the 2012-13 fiscal year. Effective July 1, 2012.

H 1134. DOT TO STUDY TOLLS ON INTERSTATE 95. Filed 5/24/12. *TO STUDY THE IMPOSITION OF TOLLS ON INTERSTATE 95 AND TO DELAY TOLLING UNTIL APPROVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.*

Appropriates \$300,000 from the Highway Fund to the Department of Transportation (DOT) to study, before establishing or collecting tolls on Interstate 95, the impact of tolling, as detailed. Prohibits the DOT from tolling Interstate 95 without prior approval by the General Assembly.

H 1135. MODIFY 2011 APPROPRIATIONS ACT. Filed 5/24/12. *TO MODIFY THE CURRENT OPERATIONS AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS APPROPRIATIONS ACT OF 2011 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.*

Blank bill.

H 1136. [THE WOMAN'S RIGHT TO CHOOSE ACT.](#) Filed 5/24/12. *REPEALING THE WOMAN'S RIGHT TO KNOW ACT AND PROHIBITING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES FROM USING STATE APPROPRIATIONS TO MAINTAIN ANY REQUIREMENTS OF THE WOMAN'S RIGHT TO KNOW ACT.*

As title indicates, repeals Article 11 of GS Chapter 90 and prohibits the Department of Health and Human Services from using funds for the article. Effective July 1, 2012.

H 1137. [AMERICAN FLAG SPECIAL PLATE.](#) Filed 5/24/12. *TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO PRODUCE A SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATE WITH THE FLAG OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA ON ITS FACE.*

Amends GS 20-79.4(b) as title indicates. Plate issuance is contingent on the receipt of at least 300 plate applications. Effective July 1, 2012.

H 1139. [PROMOTE RENEWABLE JOBS.](#) Filed 5/24/12. *TO PROVIDE INCENTIVES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND MANUFACTURE OF COMPONENTS FOR PLUG-IN ELECTRIC VEHICLES.*

Enacts new GS 105-129.16K to provide a credit of 25% to any taxpayer who constructs, converts, or expands a commercial facility to manufacture components for plug-in electric vehicles. Sets out additional details on the credit, and sunsets the credit on January 1, 2017. Adds the definition for *plug-in electric vehicle component* to GS 105-129.15. Adds *plug-in electric vehicle component* to GS 105-129.55(a) to allow a research and development credit of 5% and adds the defined term to GS 105-129.50.

Applies to taxes imposed for tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2012.

H 1140. [FUNDS FOR PUBLIC HEALTH LAB.](#) Filed 5/24/12. *TO APPROPRIATE ADDITIONAL FUNDS FOR THE NEW PUBLIC HEALTH LAB.*

Appropriates \$428,361 for 2012-13 from the General Fund to the Department of Administration as title indicates. Effective July 1, 2012.

H 1141. [RIVERLINK PLATE.](#) Filed 5/24/12. *TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO PRODUCE A SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATE FOR RIVERLINK.*

Amends GS 20-79.4(b) as title indicates. Plate issuance is contingent on the receipt of at least 300 plate applications. Establishes a special plate fee of \$30 and requires that \$20 of that amount be transferred quarterly to Riverlink Inc., to support the economic and environmental revitalization of the French Broad River. Effective July 1, 2012.

H 1142. [EXEMPT LIVESTOCK TRAILERS FROM FEES/REG.](#) Filed 5/24/12. *EXEMPT TRAILERS USED BY FARMERS TO TRANSPORT LIVESTOCK FROM VEHICLE REGISTRATION AND CERTIFICATE OF TITLE REQUIREMENTS, INCLUDING THE FEES ASSOCIATED WITH THOSE REQUIREMENTS, WHEN THE TRAILERS ARE USED TO TRANSPORT LIVESTOCK FROM FARM TO FARM OR FROM FARM TO MARKET.*

Amends GS 20-51(6) as the title indicates. Effective October 1, 2012.

H 1143. [HONOR SHAW LADY BEARS BASKETBALL TEAM.](#) Filed 5/24/12. *HONORING THE SHAW UNIVERSITY WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM ON WINNING THE 2012 NATIONAL COLLEGIATE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION DIVISION II CHAMPIONSHIP.*

As title indicates.

H 1144. [RESTORE FUNDS/WOMEN'S PREVENTIVE HEALTH SVCS.](#) Filed 5/24/12. *APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, DIVISION OF PUBLIC HEALTH, FOR*

CONTINUED FUNDING OF PLANNED PARENTHOOD, INC., AND AFFILIATED ORGANIZATIONS; AND REPEALING THE PROHIBITION ON FUNDING FOR PLANNED PARENTHOOD DURING THE 2011-2013 FISCAL BIENNIUM.

Appropriates \$343,000 for 2012-13 from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health for purposes as the title indicates. Specifies that the funds are to be used to continue contracts and grants to Planned Parenthood, Inc. and affiliated organizations that engage in preventive services critical to the health of women, including cervical cancer screening and breast cancer screening. Repeals Section 10.19 of SL 2011-145 which prohibits funding for Planned Parenthood for the 2011-13 fiscal biennium. Effective July 1, 2012.

H 1145. PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE OVERSIGHT COMMISSION. Filed 5/24/12. *TO ESTABLISH THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE OVERSIGHT COMMISSION.*

Establishes the 24-member Joint Legislative Public Infrastructure Oversight Commission (Commission), with members appointed as specified, to examine public infrastructure issues in the state and make recommendations to the General Assembly on coordinated local, regional and state public infrastructure planning and investment. Details terms and meeting requirements, and sets out the Commission's purpose and powers, including the power to inventory existing funding sources and study ways to leverage private sector capital. Directs the Commission to report to specified entities by April 1 each year. Appropriates \$100,000 from the General Fund for 2012-13 to fund the Commission.

H 1146. MAKE DISABLED CHILD ED. TAX CREDIT REFUNDABLE. Filed 5/24/12. *TO MAKE THE INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX CREDIT FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES WHO REQUIRE SPECIAL EDUCATION REFUNDABLE.*

Amends GS 105-151.33(g) to provide as title indicates (current law carries forward any unused portion of the credit for three years). Effective for tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2012, and applicable to semesters for which the credit is claimed beginning on or after that date.

H 1147. MODIFY 2011 APPROPRIATIONS ACT. Filed 5/24/12. *TO MODIFY THE CURRENT OPERATIONS AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS APPROPRIATIONS ACT OF 2011 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.*

H 1148. MODIFY 2011 APPROPRIATIONS ACT. Filed 5/24/12. *TO MODIFY THE CURRENT OPERATIONS AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS APPROPRIATIONS ACT OF 2011 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.*

H 1149. NEW MARKETS JOB ACT. Filed 5/24/12. *TO ENACT NEW MARKETS JOB GROWTH INVESTMENT INITIATIVE.*

Adds new Article 3L, *NC New Markets Job Growth Investment Initiative*, to GS Chapter 105 to provide a tax credit of amounts ranging from 0 to 7% for qualified equity investments. Defines *quality equity investment* as an equity investment in, or long-term debt security issued by, a qualified community development entity that (1) is acquired after the act's effective date at its original issuance for cash, (2) has at least 85% of its purchase price used to make qualified low-income community investments in qualified in state low-income community businesses, as specified, and (3) is designated as a qualified equity investment and certified by the Department of Commerce (Department). Defines *qualified active low-income community business*, *qualified community development entity*, and additional terms. Provides details on the tax credit, and directs the Department to limit qualified equity investments as necessary to cap the tax credits at \$40 million a year. Sets out the procedure for a qualified community development entity to apply to the Department for an equity investment or long-term debt security to be designated as a qualified equity investment. Allows recapture of the credit under certain circumstances. Requires the Secretary of Commerce to issue binding letter rulings in response to applicants

requesting an interpretation of the law to a specific set of facts. Applies to qualified equity investments made in tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2013.

S 896. LICENSE PLATE BACKGROUND (=H 1035). Filed 5/24/12. *TO AUTHORIZE THE CONTINUED ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES WITH UNIQUE PLATE BACKGROUND DESIGNS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE TRANSPORTATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.*

Identical to H 1035, filed 5/22/12.

S 897. LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS MEMORIAL PLATE. Filed 5/24/12. *AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO PRODUCE A SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATE FOR THE NATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS MEMORIAL.*

Amends GS 20-79.4(b) to add a special registration plate as the title indicates. Provides that the development of the plate is contingent on receiving at least 300 plate applications. Establishes a special plate fee of \$30. Distributes \$10 of the fee amount to the Special Registration Plate Account and \$20 to the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account (CCAPA). Amends GS 20-81.12 to direct the Division of Motor Vehicles to make a quarterly transfer of the money in the CCAPA earned from the sale of these plates to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund to support the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C. Effective July 1, 2012.

H 1124. FARM EQUIPMENT ON CONTROLLED ACCESS U.S. 17. Filed 5/24/12. *TO ALLOW FARM EQUIPMENT TO TRAVEL ON THE FULLY CONTROLLED ACCESS PORTIONS OF U.S. 17 IN PASQUOTANK COUNTY ONLY.*

As the title indicates. Declares that the names and boundaries of voting tabulation districts, tracts, block groups, and blocks specified in this section are as indicated in the 2010 Census Redistricting Tiger/Line Shapefiles. Provides that a change in any voting tabulation district boundary does not result in a change in the boundary of a district, instead the boundary of a district will remain the same as it is depicted by the 2010 Census Redistricting Tiger/Line Shapefiles. Effective beginning with the 2014 primary and general election.

H 1138. DAVIDSON COUNTY DESIGN BUILD. Filed 5/24/12. *PERMIT THE COUNTY OF DAVIDSON TO UTILIZE THE DESIGN-BUILD METHOD OF CONSTRUCTION AND RENOVATION OF COUNTY BUILDINGS.*

As the title indicates. Provides requirements for the process of seeking bids for the project and selecting a design-build team with which to contract for the project.

S 898. BEAR GRASS SCHOOL PROPERTY CONVEYANCE. Filed 5/24/12. *REQUIRE THE MARTIN COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION TO CONVEY THE BEAR GRASS SCHOOL PROPERTY TO THE TOWN OF BEAR GRASS ON A LEASE-TO-PURCHASE BASIS FOR SPECIFIED CONSIDERATION.*

As the title indicates. Specifies that the consideration is to be \$45,000 per year as lease payments for 10 years and the sum of \$1 for purchase at the end of the 10th year.

S 899. DURHAM COUNTY MEMORIAL STADIUM (=H 1123). Filed 5/24/12. *AMENDING THE ACT AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTMENT OF AN AUTHORITY TO CONTROL THE MANAGEMENT OF A MEMORIAL STADIUM TO BE ERECTED BY DURHAM COUNTY, TO INCREASE ITS MEMBERSHIP, AND TO AMEND ITS TERM LIMITS.*

Identical to H 1123, filed 5/23/12.

S 900. SURF CITY DEANNEXATION. Filed 5/24/12. *REMOVE CERTAIN DESCRIBED PROPERTY FROM THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF SURF CITY.*

Removes three tracts, as described, from Surf City's corporate limits. Effective June 30, 2012.

S 901. OCEAN ISLE BEACH SATELLITE ANNEXATION. Filed 5/24/12. *REMOVE THE CAP ON SATELLITE ANNEXATIONS FOR THE TOWN OF OCEAN ISLE BEACH.*

Amends GS 160A-58.1(b)(5) to add Ocean Isle Beach to the list of towns and cities exempt from the cap on satellite annexations.

SUMMARIES OF AMENDMENTS AND COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTES

HOUSE BILLS

H 517. MAGISTRATES/CALENDARING. Filed 3/29/11. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition.

Makes the amendments to GS 7A-173 (concerning removal or suspension of magistrate from duties) effective January 1, 2013 (was, January 1, 2012), and applicable to charges filed on or after that date. Makes additional technical and clarifying changes.

Amends GS 7A-49.4(c) to clarify that the senior resident superior court judge may provide notice and schedule a trial conference if a case has not been tried within nine months after the defendant was indicted or bound over to superior court (previously allowed a district attorney to object upon a showing of good cause). Changes the effective date for the amendment to January 1, 2013 (was, January 1, 2012). Sets the reporting date for the Administrative Office of the Courts at March 1, 2013.

Courts

H 952. STATE AIR TOXICS PROGRAM REFORMS. Filed 5/16/12. *TO EXEMPT FROM STATE AIR TOXICS EMISSIONS CONTROLS THOSE SOURCES OF EMISSIONS THAT ARE SUBJECT TO CERTAIN FEDERAL EMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS, TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO REQUIRE PERMIT CONDITIONS THAT ELIMINATE UNACCEPTABLE RISKS TO HUMAN HEALTH, TO DIRECT THE DIVISION OF AIR QUALITY TO REVIEW THE STATE AIR TOXICS PROGRAM, AND TO REQUIRE REPORTS ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS ACT, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW COMMISSION.*

Amends GS 143-215.107(a)(5) (concerning air quality standards) to require the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) to review permit applications for new or modified sources or facilities that would increase emission of toxic air pollutants; if DENR finds, through modeling, epidemiological studies, monitoring data, or other information, that the emission would pose an unacceptable risk to human health, the operator must submit a permit application that eliminates the risk. Exempts from rules controlling emission of toxic air pollutants any source that is subject to specified federal rules. Makes conforming changes.

Directs the Environmental Management Commission and the Division of Air Quality (Division) of DENR to review and amend their adopted rules, as detailed. Sets out Division reporting requirements.

S 26. NORTH CAROLINA BENEFIT CORPORATION ACT. Filed 2/1/11. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition.

Changes the act's effective date from December 1, 2011, to October 1, 2012. Makes technical changes.

S 810. REGULATORY REFORM ACT OF 2012. Filed 5/17/12. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition.

Amends proposed subsection (h) in GS 150B-19.1 (rule-making requirements for agencies) to clarify the different requirements for agencies in the Governor's Cabinet and for Council of State agencies, when the agency submits a proposed rule change. Deletes proposed GS 143B-10.1, which required agencies auditing businesses or individuals to first provide notice, and instead directs each state agency to submit a report of the audit and the amount of notice required to the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedure Oversight Committee by October 31, 2012. Makes a conforming change to the bill title.
