H 77 (2019-2020) [DOT 2020-2021 FY BUDGET/GOVERNANCE. \(NEW\)](#) Filed Feb 13 2019, *AN ACT TO ADJUST THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION CERTIFIED BUDGET FOR THE 2020-2021 FISCAL YEAR AND TO IMPLEMENT GOVERNANCE MEASURES AND OTHER MODIFICATIONS RELATED TO THE OPERATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT.*

Senate amendments makes the following changes to the 5th edition.

Amendment #2 amends Parts IV and V.

Part IV

Revises the changes proposed to GS 136-44.2E(c) in Amendment #1, to require the Secretary of Transportation to access and use funds in the Emergency Reserve in a manner that ensures the funds are eligible for reimbursement or for cost sharing of federal funds (previously, eligible for federal reimbursement only).

Part V

Adds to Section 5.2. Modifies the limitation on the Department of Transportation (DOT)'s contractual commitments based on available cash balance by allowing the DOT to make commitments necessary to restore transportation infrastructure damaged as a result of a natural disaster or other emergency. Requires the Secretary of Transportation to report such a commitment within 72 hours to the Board of Transportation, the Transportation Oversight Manager at the Office of State Budget and Management, and the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee. Sets expiration of this authority for January 1, 2021.

Amendment #3 amends Part V.

Part V

Adds to the proposed changes to GS 143B-350(b)(1), concerning changes to the Board of Transportation (BOT), to delete the proposed requirement that one member elected by the Executive Committee of the Local Government Commission shall serve as an ex officio nonvoting member of the Board. Additionally, eliminates proposed member qualifications in proposed subdivision (b)(5). Makes conforming changes regarding BOT membership, as amended.

Modifies GS 143B-350(e) regarding the meeting and organization of the BOT so that the Governor selects the chair for a two-year term and may select a chair for an additional two-year term (under current law, the BOT selects the chair).

H 258 (2019-2020) **OPEN AMUSEMENT PARKS/ARCADES/VENUES. (NEW)** Filed Mar 4 2019, *AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AMUSEMENT PARKS, GAMING AND BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS WITH VIDEO GAMES AND ARCADE GAMES, AND VENUES FOR RECEPTIONS OR PARTIES TO RESUME OPERATIONS.*

Senate amendments makes the following changes to the 4th edition.

Amendment #1 expands the act's provisions to also authorize any fair or carnival that is a member of the NC Association of Agricultural Fairs to open and resume operations. Makes the requirements and restrictions applicable to amusement parks and establishments with video games and arcade games applicable to fairs and carnivals. Makes conforming changes to the executive and departmental authorities set forth in Sections 2 and 3. Modifies the effective date of Section 1, now authorizing amusement parks, establishments with video games and arcade games, and fairs and carnivals to operate, to further specify that the provisions do not expire until applicable declaration of emergency prohibitions and restrictions are terminated to also allow unrestricted mass gatherings (previously, only to allow full unrestricted operations).

Amendment #2 adds a new Section 4.5 to authorize outdoor stadiums with a spectator capacity of 12,000 or less that operates a restaurant on the premises of the stadium to open and operate food and drink service for on-premises consumption notwithstanding a state of emergency declared by the governor or a city or county related to the COVID-19 public health emergency. Stadiums allowed to open are subject to seven requirements, including: (1) that the stadium was in existence and lawfully operating with proper ABC permits on March 10, 2020; (2) outdoor food and drink service seating capacity is limited to 10% of the spectator capacity of the stadium; (3) the establishment maintains and enforces social distancing; and (4) the establishment complies with state public health regulations. Effective when the act becomes law and expires upon the later of any applicable state of emergency declaration affecting establishment operations being terminated, or October 31, 2020.

Adds new Section 4.6 and 4.7 to mirror the executive and departmental authorities described in Sections 2 and 3 to make the same provisions applicable to the outdoor stadiums described.

Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to the 2nd edition.

Changes the long and short titles.

Deletes the content of the previous edition and replaces it with the following.

Authorizes the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) to seek a one-year temporary waiver from the USDA for time limits established by federal law related to the food and nutrition program for able-bodied adults without dependents. The Department must submit the waiver request within nine months of the end of the federal emergency period. Prohibits the Department from seeking an additional waiver without express legislative authority.

Senate committee substitute to the 2nd edition makes the following changes.

Revises the long title to refer to the *misdemeanant* confinement program (was, *misdemeanor* confinement program). Makes conforming changes throughout.

Revises several proposed changes set out in Section 8 to provide that if a juvenile who is confined in a facility turns 18 while in custody, custody of the juvenile may be transferred from the Juvenile Justice Section of the Division of Adult Correction and Juvenile Justice to the appropriate sheriff. Amends the following statutes accordingly: GS 15A-521; GS 15A-1343(a1)(3); GS 15A-1343.2(e)(5) and (f)(6); GS 15A-1344(d2) and (e); GS 15A-1351(a); and GS 15A-1352(a) and (f).

Amends Section 8(c) to make further conforming changes to GS 15A-521(c)(3) regarding release orders.

Amends Section 8(l) to make technical and clarifying changes to the proposed revisions in GS 148-13 regarding earned time and good credits.

Amends Section 8(p) to extend the effective date for the revisions in Section 8 related to juvenile detention from July 1, 2020, to August 1, 2020.

Revises proposed GS 14-269.2(k1), which allows a person who has a valid concealed handgun permit under Article 54B, or a person exempt from obtaining a permit to possess and carry a handgun, despite prohibitions, subject to five conditions.

Amends the fourth condition to limit the described privilege to possessing and carrying a handgun on educational property outside of any time when curricular or extracurricular activities are taking place on the premises and any time when the premises are being used for school-sponsored activities (rather than used for educational, instructional, or school-sponsored activities).

Senate amendments make the following changes to the 5th edition.

Amendment #1

Adds new subsection (9) to GS 143-214.8 requiring the Division of Mitigation Services (Division) to include a new component focused on restoration and monitoring of projects or land acquisitions that create or restore flood storage capacity.

Adds new subsection (7) to GS 143-214.9 to authorize the Division to reduce flood risk by creating or restoring flood storage capacity in streams, wetlands, and floodplains.

Revises GS 143-214.12(a) to authorize allocation of funds from the Ecosystem Restoration Fund for issues related to flood storage capacity and mitigation of flood risk.

Revises GS 143-214.13(a) to require the Division to include information about flood storage capacity projects in required reports. Revises GS 143-214.13(b) to require the Department of Environmental Quality to maintain an inventory of property that enhances or restores flood storage capacity.

Enacts GS 143-214.11A to require that, to the extent funds are available for this purpose, basinwide plans developed pursuant to GS 143-214.10 include plans for restoration and enhancement of flood storage capacity. Directs the Division to establish an

advisory board to guide program development and implementation for flood storage enhancement or restoration projects. Directs the Division to comply with procurement preferences in GS 143-214.11(i).

Makes technical changes.

Amends long title.

Amendment #2

Adds new Section 9A to the bill directing the Division of Water Infrastructure to allocate \$310,000 of funds appropriated for 2020-21 to abate an imminent hazard to public health caused by damage to a specific sewer line.

Amends Section 11 to add to the water resources development projects intended to receive funds carried forward to include West Onslow CSRSM and Cape Fear Lock and Dam #2 and #3 Fish Ramp. Specifies carry forward amounts. Adjusts carry forward amounts for other projects and makes conforming changes.

Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to the 3rd edition.

Part II

Replaces the previously proposed changes to GS 116-239.8 with the following. Amends the statute to require the Board of Governors (BOG) and the State Board of Education to jointly determine the standards for establishing the costs to local school administrative units for providing the facilities and services described for operation and maintenance of a laboratory school. Details requirements of the standards. Requires local school administrative units to provide specified facilities and services to a laboratory school upon request. Requires a memorandum of understanding between the chancellor and the local school administrative unit for operation and maintenance regarding facilities and leases, transportation costs, food services, and student support services. Details parameters for the provision of each service. Makes conforming changes to GS 116-239.11. Applies to leases and agreements entered into on or after the date the act becomes law, applying beginning with the 2021-22 school year and subsequent school years.

Changes the source and amount of appropriated funds for administrative and technical assistance related to the UNC Teacher and Principal Preparation Laboratory School Program.
